President's message

I hope everyone had an enjoyable time at our annual silent auction last month because I know I did. There was some heated bidding on items, and I am sure that some people were bidding me up on purpose! It was a great success, with the club raising over \$1000.00. I would like to thank those who donated items to the auction, and our members for opening up their wallets.

March is a frustrating time for me as I cannot wait until the snow melts so that I can see how my buried trees are doing. I now have a better appreciation of why people have tropical (indoor) bonsai: because it keeps them busy and satisfies any bonsai addiction, while temperate trees take their much-needed rest.

But not all bonsai artists keep tropical trees just as an addiction fix for the winter months. Instead, it's a true love for the different varieties that come from tropical climates. There are also many who now live in condos or apartment buildings and whose only option is to have indoor tree varieties. This by no means lessens the quality of their bonsai. Our shows have been graced with Brazilian Rain trees, dwarf Jade trees (*Portulacaria afra*), bougainvillea, Ficus retusa, olive trees, and so on - all make very good quality bonsai. Of course, tropical and sub tropical trees need special care for indoor conditions here in Toronto, and in some case they require different bonsai techniques as well.

The program for our next meeting on March 9th will be a discussion of indoor bonsai exclusively, starting with the Bonsai 101 class (beginners session), where we will repot a tropical tree. During the main meeting, we will have a short presentation by Lilly Tsurulnikov, and then Mike Roussel will take centre stage with a bonsai demo on a ficus that had a major set back, during the ice storm of December, 2013.

Regular TBS meetings

Meetings take place on the second Monday of every month, except July and August, at the TBG (Toronto Botanical Gardens), located at 777 Lawrence Avenue East, at Leslie Street, in the studio rooms upstairs at 7:30 pm. The general meetings frequently include demonstrations of bonsai techniques, critiques of bonsai trees, and workshops, in which each participant styles a tree with the help of an experienced member. These meetings are preceded at 6:45 p.m. by the the Bonsai 101 beginner sessions, held upstairs.

A small fee is charged for workshops, and a tree, wire and instructor are provided. To participate in workshops, it is necessary to register in advance of the meeting so that materials can be provided.

Members are encouraged to bring in bonsai to show and work on during the meetings. Wire is provided at no charge. Non-members may attend a meeting at no charge to see if the club is of interest to them.

Library hours and policy

The library is open to members at the beginning of our regular meetings. Members may borrow books free of charge for one month. Late returns cost \$2 per month with a minimum charge of \$2. Please return all materials during the next meeting, and **especially** before the summer break.

Membership desk

The membership desk will be open at all meetings. The opening time may be extended for the first fall meeting to assist with renewals. You may also register for workshops there.
